

FREE DRONE PILOT CERTIFICATION TRAINING

The Ohio Department of Transportation (ODOT) is offering FREE e-learning courses that provide the fundamental knowledge needed in preparing for the Unmanned Aircraft Systems (UAS) Remote Pilot Certification Exam. This is a great place to start for eligible persons (ages 16 and up) who would like to fly UAS for work-related applications.

Here are just a few of the areas where you can apply your drone certification skills:

- Surveying of property
- Surveying and inspections of roads, bridges, buildings, telecommunication structures
- Public Safety and Homeland Security
- Filmmaking/Photography
- Delivery/Fulfilment


According to ZipRecruiter.com, the national average salary for certified drone pilots is \$58,280/year.

Course Structure



- 1. Access the Ohio LTAP Center's eLearning website at: http://learning.transportation.ohio.gov
- 2. If you already have a "MyODOT" login, proceed to step 3. If not, please follow the instructions for **New Users** available on the webpage and register for a username and password.
- 3. Click on the link available at the bottom of the eLearning website to access the Login page for the eLearning system (labeled **Login**).
- 4. Using your MyODOT approved username and password, please login to the Ohio LTAP Center's CourseMill program.
 - a. If your username and password will not login and need to be reset, please return to the Ohio LTAP Center's eLearning website (link above) and follow the instructions for resetting your password.
- 5. Select the "Course Catalog" tab (top of screen). Courses are listed alphabetically in the pages of the Catalog. You can locate the UAS Remote Pilot Certification Training modules quickly by typing UAS in the Title box, and then clicking Search.









What is MyODOT

MyODOT is website that allows individuals to request a web account (user ID and password) that allows them to access many systems within ODOT that require login credentials.

The types of MyODOT accounts that may be requested are:

Primary account

A primary account owner is the person who creates the first MyODOT account on behalf of an organization or business and uses that account as their personal account for accessing applications within ODOT. As a Primary account owner for an organization this person can create Secondary accounts for specific applications within ODOT. Primary accounts must be approved by authorized ODOT personnel.

Secondary account

For those organizations that have multiple individuals who need access to ODOT applications, i.e. subcontractors working for a primary contractor, ODOT offers a Secondary account. Secondary accounts are created by designated Primary account owners.

Basic account

Individuals that are neither Primary account owners or Secondary account owners may request a Basic account. This will be their personal account for accessing systems within ODOT. Basic accounts must be approved by authorized ODOT personnel.
